


Prove or Predict



Predict what might happen from the details given and implied.


- From the cover what do you think the text is going to be about?
- What is happening now? What happened before this? What will happen after?
- What does this paragraph suggest will happen next? What makes you think this?
- Do you think the choice of setting will influence how the plot develops?
- Do you think... will happen? Yes, no or maybe? Explain your answer using evidence from the text.
- Find and copy a group of words which show that...
- How do these words make the reader feel? How do the descriptions of ... show that they are ...?
- How can you tell that?
- What impression of ... do you get from these paragraphs?
- What voice might these characters use?
- What was ... thinking when ...?
- Who is telling the story?



Link to own preferences, expressing ideas, noticing themes and conventions.

- Why is the text arranged this way?
- What structures has the author used?
- What is the purpose of this text feature?
- Is the use of ... effective?
- The mood of the character changes throughout this text. Find and copy phrases which show this.
- What is the author's point of view?
- What affect does... have on the audience?
- How does the author engage the reader here?
- What section was the most interesting/exciting part?
- How are these sections linked?

Expression and Fluency



Reading with expression and fluency, performing and retelling.

- Can you retell the story in your own words?
- Listen to me read that sentence...can you now read it with the correct expression?
- Try performing that section of the story. What would the characters do? What would they say?
- Now re-read that sentence so that you read fluently.






Retrieve and record information and identify key details from fiction and non-fiction.

- How would you describe this story/ text? What genre is it? How do you know?

<u>Summarise</u>



Summarise the main idea from more than one paragraph.

- Can you summarise in a sentence the opening/middle/ending of the story?
- In what order do these chapter headings come in the story?
