

- We pride ourselves on our excellent sporting achievements. Children have the opportunity to represent our school at events across Surrey.
- We offer a huge range of after school clubs. There really is something for everyone. Some of clubs include: Basketball, Judo, Chess, Young Engineers, Cross-country, Netball and Football.
- Graitney, our before and after school care provision, ensures that those who need wrap around care know that their children are being looked after in a safe and stimulating environment.

Crawley Ridge Junior School is a caring school with a team of dedicated professionals who ensure that the children get the most from their education. Every member of staff is committed to providing the children with a happy, well-disciplined environment where all children can make the most of every learning opportunity offered to them.

The whole school curriculum is carefully planned to challenge all children and to give continuity and progression through their time at Crawley Ridge. Building upon previous successful experience, children become more confident and independent in their learning. Central to our curriculum is the development of reading, writing and mathematics skills which underpin all we do; ensuring that our pupils leave us able to communicate effectively and contribute fully in today's society.

## Homework

All children have some form of homework each week and we believe it is an important part of learning, where children can reinforce what is learnt at school; develop independence and good work habits; involve the family in a child's schooling and prepare children for the next stage of education.



## Special Educational Needs

It is the policy of the school to ensure early identification of SEN and to support the child in the most appropriate way. Support may include one or more of the following : individual programmes of work within the classroom, inclusion in small intervention groups, advice and involvement of one of the learning support services, assessment and advice from the educational psychologist. Our experienced Inclusion Leader leads, monitors and reviews provision for SEN pupils and ensures consultation with parents.



## Educational Visits

All our learning is supported by our commitment to ensure high quality trips and visits take place. These are an integral part of our curriculum and ensure that learning is brought to life for each child. All children visit a place of worship each year linked to their learning in RE; through this they build a greater understanding of the beliefs and practices of different religions. Other trips include: Butser Farm, Henley Fort, Wisley Gardens and Hampton Court Palace. We also welcome visitors into school to carry out workshops and assemblies. These have included: author visits, Ancient Egyptian and Greek workshops, and a zoo .

## Residential Trips

We organise over-night residential trips for the children at Crawley Ridge. This begins in Year 4 with a sleepover opportunity to build confidence in staying away from home. We then visit Portsmouth with our Year 5 for two nights. This trip is closely linked with their Tudor topic and they spend each day visiting local attractions. In Year 6 a two night activity residential provides children with the opportunity to develop vital team building and resilience skills ready for the transition to secondary school.



## Resources

We are incredibly lucky at Crawley Ridge to have vast grounds in which to learn and play, this includes; our playground, field, Forest School and pond area. Our large hall space plays host to our annual Carol and Spring concerts, Year 6 Leavers' performance and other class assemblies throughout the year. The Studio provides space for music lessons, cooking and a well-resourced library. In order to fully support our curriculum, we have high quality resources for all subject areas and have a large number of laptops for use across the school. Each class also has access to iPads to support teaching and learning.



### **Forest School**

Our Forest School is an inspirational environment offering children opportunities to develop social skills, self-esteem and confidence through hands on learning experiences in our woodland environment. At CRJS, activities are linked to the curriculum and are designed for child-led learning in order to encourage our children to explore their thoughts, feelings and relationships and understanding of the world around us. Our Forest School offers children opportunities to be successful, take risks, make choices and initiate learning for themselves.

### **OPAL**

OPAL play is an initiative that we have launched to ensure that children at CRJS have the most imaginative, fun playtimes possible. The children have access to a range of areas and resources across our site including a mud pit, woodland trails, scooters, soft toys, den building, trim trail, climbing wall, quiet space and more. The children love the freedom they have and the opportunity to be totally creative in the outdoor area.

### **Pastoral**

We are a small school and take pride in getting to know every person in it for the individual they are. Every member of the staff team feels a responsibility to each child and works hard to ensure that emotional well-being is nurtured throughout their time with us. Our three highly skilled Emotional Literacy Support Assistants (ELSAs) are on hand to support children to deal with difficulties in all aspects of life. From friendships to issues around bereavement and loss, they are there to listen and to offer practical strategies to help children manage their emotions, so that their learning can continue. For those children starting school in Year 3, we always pair them with an older child who acts as a buddy and mentor. This buddy supports the child during those first few weeks while they settle into the routines of our school.

### **Pupil Parliament**

We believe that there is a leader in every child. From the simple day to day leadership of organising oneself or leading a small group in a presentation to representing the school more widely. Our Pupil Parliament, which is made up of 4 councils, plays an active part in developing our school. The Learning Council works with senior leadership to think about learning, behaviour and curriculum. The Eco-Council supports the school community to work sustainably, our Well-being Council promotes the importance of mental health and well-being and our Digital Leaders support the use of technology across the school.

### **Extra- curricular**

At Crawley Ridge we offer a range of extra-curricular opportunities. Clubs or specialist teaching take place before, during and after the school day. Specialist music tuition includes piano, flute and fife. Other clubs on offer include: Judo, Chess, Football, Netball, Cross-country, Basketball, Drama, Choir, Young Engineer and Crafts. This is just a sample of what we have to offer. We continue to add to the range of activities all the time.

## Working Together

### Parent Partnership

We believe that a positive relationship between school and parents is crucial for our pupils to achieve to the best of their ability and to empower them to develop as confident and caring individuals. We welcome parents' involvement as this helps our understanding of the individual child and, together, enables us to develop them into rounded individuals.

Links between home and school form an important basis for helping children feel secure in their learning environment and parents add so much by assisting both in and outside the classroom. At the start of each term we provide an overview of the curriculum and we send regular newsletters to keep parents informed of day-to-day happenings. The school also offers parent consultation evenings each term, as well as an annual report to keep you informed about your child's achievements.

A variety of parent workshops are offered throughout the year to enable parents to support their children in subjects such as reading and mathematics.

### The Alliance Multi-Academy Trust

Crawley Ridge Junior School is part of The Alliance Multi-Academy Trust (TAMAT). This is a trust of five like-minded schools in the Surrey Heath area who have come together to work in partnership with a focus on enriching the education of every child in the trust. ## Wrap-around Care– Graitney

Graitney aims to provide high quality, affordable, reliable and accessible before and after school childcare for children aged between 4-11 years who attend Crawley Ridge Junior and Infant Schools.

Graitney cares for up to 40 children at the Breakfast Club and up to 50 children at the After School Club, providing a play centered environment where children feel safe, secure and happy.

The team of staff at Graitney endeavour to meet every child's individual needs. Playworkers understand the value of play; that it is essential in every child's life and vital to their development. Graitney therefore aims to create a fun, exciting and safe environment, where children are inspired and motivated through structured and informal activities. Older children are even encouraged to get involved in the planning for the following week, which gives them the opportunity to make choices on how they wish to spend their free time.
