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# Sports Day

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This year we are holding our traditional Crawley Ridge sports day on **Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> May** from 12:50pm to 15:05pm, for all year groups.

The children will take part in a carousel of sporting activities on the field alongside other members of their class. Each child will compete in their house colours and will contribute a score for their team in every event. Over the course of this half term, the children have been spending some of their P.E. time developing the skills needed to take part in the afternoon with confidence.

Children will require their usual P.E. kit along with a t-shirt of the appropriate colour for their team. (This is based on their house colours, Frimley is red, Collingwood is blue, Elsenwood is yellow and Graitney is green.)

Children requiring a green t-shirt will use their normal P.E top. Members of the Year 5/6 Sports Crew can use their crew t-shirts if it matches their given team colour. If you are struggling to find a top of the correct colour, please let us know and we can find a coloured bib for your child to wear.

On 21<sup>st</sup> May, children should come to school in their normal uniform and school shoes, their full P.E. kit should be in a bag ready to change into at lunchtime. Families are invited to join us on the field from 12:45pm. At the end of the events, there will be a presentation to close proceedings. Children will then be sent to their classrooms to retrieve all their belongings, then they can then meet you on the playground to go home.

Sports Day is a fantastic occasion where families can come together and enjoy celebrating their children's talents outside of the classroom, however it requires a lot of adult support to ensure it is a success for all involved.

Remember that sports day is not the appropriate time to approach class teachers, they are there to supervise and support your children in their events. Please follow their lead and enjoy the afternoon.
